



Letter from Our CEO

It's an exciting time at Vita Living as we enter our 6th year of sustainable business practices and continue to deepen relationships with Houston's philanthropic community. With your help in 2018, we raised over \$1,000,000 in charitable contributions to support the Vita Living Mission.

In 2018, we served 434 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) through our residential and CLASS programs. 100% of our residential clients are low-income, and 100% of our group homes are located in Houston.

Generous donors enable Vita Living to serve clients whom other programs are unable to accommodate. Most of our clients are challenged by a range of developmental and health issues as well as co-concurrent mental illnesses. Since opening our first group home in 1985, Vita Living's goal has always been to keep those we serve in the communities they know and love, regardless of behavioral challenges and evolving healthcare needs.

In Fall 2018, we launched our Vita Living Housing Initiative to build new group home prototypes. The new homes will provide our clients with maximum accessibility and a community gathering area. Additionally, the design is replicable, and we hope to share it with other similar organizations.

Serving Our Community

Without Vita Living, adults with IDD may face a grim fate of homelessness, jail time, or institutionalization. With your support, we are committed to keeping these individuals in the community, which has shown incredible benefits for their quality of life. Our programs include:

- Residential. Vita Living owns and operates 19 Houston-based group homes with the capacity to serve 78 adults with IDD.
- Day Program. Approximately 70 of our clients attend the Vita Living Center, our centrally located day program.
- Case Management. Vita Living provides case management for over 300 children and adults across a seven-county region.

We also offer our residential clients nursing care, behavioral services and transportation. The medical support we provide to residents prevents unnecessary hospitalizations. Our level of care prevents ER visits and long nursing home stays.



Program Improvements

- 2018 was our second year of a three year plan for transportation improvement and vehicle replacement. We have replaced seven vans. Vita Living provides transportation to each of our residents for their many activities, including medical appointments, The Vita Living Center, church services, community outings, and more.
- Our CLASS program census has increased by 10 across seven Texas counties (Harris, Ft. Bend, Galveston, Montgomery, Brazoria, Austin, and Waller).

- We've enhanced technology across the agency. Medical charts and client case notes are now completely online, which increases efficiency for medical appointments and client services.
- 14 of our 19 group homes have been completely renovated to better serve our aging residents. The homes now offer full accessibility, improved functionality and aesthetics.






We Love Volunteers!

Your Investment: Financials for Fiscal Year 2018




Contributions & Other Fundraising
