Juan is thriving in the new environment and is a positive and caring roommate and neighbor.

The new Campbell homes were built to address all the functional needs of our residents and their caretakers with open floor plans, wide hallways, accessible bathrooms, a large patio and more. We are thrilled that another important payoff has been an improved sense of community and engagement for our clients. 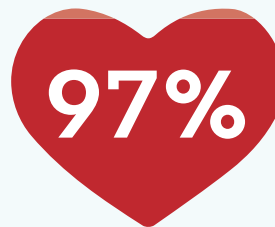

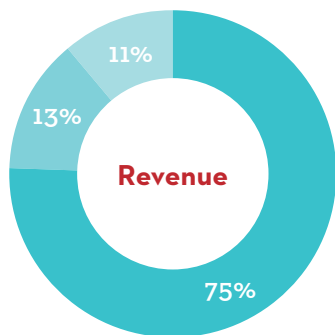

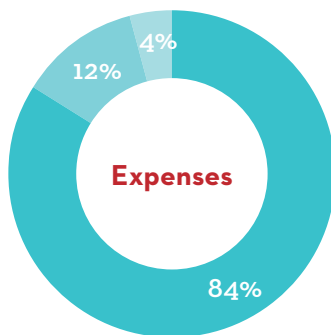
